The gathering will begin with coffee/tea around 9am with official worship opening at 9:30. Pastor Janet Lepp will be presiding. The theme will continue what the East Peoria meeting began, WHAT Does WELCA Look Like? Zion is located at 500 OLD Rt. 66. This is a one day gathering, ending by 3:30, leaving special time to visit local sites, specifically the Mother Jones Monument, and the Rt 66 Museum in nearby Litchfield. So, no hotel reservations are needed. Lunch and a "going home snack" will be provided.

So, we invite each congregation to bring a carload or two of women to experience the unity of BOLD women in 2023. Hear how others are BEING ONGOING LOVING DISCIPLES!

I look forward to this year at the Zions, and to the rich heritage becoming even richer from the work at Phoenix. MAY WE ALL RISE FROM THE ASHES and stand boldly!

2023 NORTHEAST CONFERENCE WELCA SPRING GATHERING RECAP

The Spring Gathering of the NE Conference Women of the ELCA was held on April 1, 2023 at Trinity Lutheran Church of Fairbury. Kay Hammer shared a devotion entitled "All the Bible Every Day" from a book, "Always Near" by Robert J. Morgan. 29 WELCA members, representing 9 of our 21 Conference churches attended. Our monetary offering totaled \$454.00 with half going to Lutheran World Relief and half to our Central/Southern Illinois Synod Women of the ELCA. Our new NE Conference Representative, Bobbi Thomas, from Trinity of Chenoa, gave a report and will be attending the Twelfth Triennial Convention of WELCA on September 19-21, 2023 in Phoenix, AZ. Carol Lambert of St. Paul Lutheran, Gilman, graciously accepted Donna Schuler's leadership position, as the NE Conference President.



The program provided by the Fairbury WELCA included two terrific ladies who work in jobs that provide important services in Livingston County. We first heard from Kathy Kennel, RN BSN of the Livingston County Health Department, who gave us important advice concerning nutrition and immunizations. She was followed by Detective Emily Frobish of the Livingston County Sheriffs' Association. She instructed us how we can prevent fraudulent activities on the phone, internet, mail, and other online usage.



The meeting concluded with prayer, fellowship, lunch, and a cake in appreciation for Donna Schuler's many years of service to the Women of the ELCA for the Northeast Conference and for the Central/Southern Illinois Synod Women of the ELCA Board.

CENTRAL SOUTHERN IL SYNOD WELCA RECAP

As a member of the Women of the ELCA Board of the Central/Southern Illinois Synod, I had the opportunity to stand at the WELCA table at Synod Assembly in Peoria on June 2, 2023. I wasn't sure what I was going to say or do to welcome people. But thanks to Elaine Frerichs, Secretary of our WELCA Board, our table display included a large map of our Synod with pins and photos for every congregation! So, when I asked people about their congregation they could point to exactly where it was on the map. People seemed proud to identify and talk about their church communities.



Thirteen women signed up at the table for a drawing for the Women of the ELCA's "Gather" magazine. All thirteen will be receiving a copy of this wonderful magazine that has Bible studies, relevant short articles, and devotions. Many Women of the ELCA circles use the Bible studies in the magazines which have video's that accompany them to give more insight and help you lead the studies.

I enjoyed hearing the many ways women are involved in their churches. Providing food for gatherings and funerals was almost a given for ELCA churches. Women helping make Lutheran World Relief school and hygiene kits and quilting were also very common. The Circle at my church, Grace Lutheran, Champaign, and others have monthly bible studies using the lessons from Gather Magazine. I would love to attend the St Johns, Mt Pulaski's annual Chicken and Noodle dinner and St Peters, Coatsburg's ice cream social, where Debbie Gunther is responsible for making 120 gallons of vanilla ice cream! Many women reported serving as readers, lay ministers, choir members, ushers and greeters, council and committee members. Women with special skills and training are our SAMs, pastors, deacons, secretaries, organists and choir directors.

The message of our WELCA booth at Synod Assembly was: if you are a woman who serves and participates in the life of your ELCA church, you are WELCA. WELCA is an organization with a board, budget, and constitution, but our mission is to mobilize women to act boldly on their faith through Jesus Christ. I learned some church women's groups hesitate to be part of bigger organizations such as WELCA. But I hope people will feel welcome to explore and join in WELCA activities as our communities emerge from the pandemic. I was inspired to hear about all the contributions made by the women of our Synod to their churches and communities. They are truly living their faith through service.

Toromare Mananato: *Salt and Light to the Women of Madagascar*

The C/SIS Women of the ELCA have been supporting Toromare Mananato for several years as she ministers to the people of Madagascar. Through prayer and financial assistance, we have followed her struggles to find a place for women in her church. “Women are the backbone of our society,” she asserts, yet the Malagasy Lutheran Church still offers few opportunities for women.

When Toromare was a young woman, she asked her father, a pastor, if she could study theology but was rebuffed and told that the Apostle Paul stated that women are to keep silent in church. But Toromare continued to wonder.

After her father died in 1988, she sought to pursue theological study and, through her home church she received a scholarship from the ELCA International Leaders program. As a student at Wartburg Theological Seminary in Dubuque, Iowa, she examined many biblical passages in order to understand what God wanted from her. Some texts seemed to confirm her father’s arguments, leaving her disillusioned. However, she finally realized God’s true vision when she read in Paul’s letter to the Galatians: “There is neither Jew nor Gentile, neither slave nor free, nor is there male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus.”



Emboldened by these words, Toromare returned to Madagascar after graduation, prepared to contribute to her church and spread the message of Christ’s equal love for all. Upon her return, the church appointed her the Vice General Secretary of the Malagasy Lutheran Church.

Having recognized the importance of women’s rights in the church, Toromare is determined to improve the lives of women in her church and community, and better connect them to Christ’s love. Borrowing on the words of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., she says, “I have a dream that in the future my church will ordain women like the ELCA, and my church will be the light and salt of our country.” Following the Synod Assembly in June, the synod sent over \$13,000 from offerings to support our companion synods in Madagascar. Part of that money will go to support Toromare’s ministries. But when we send our offerings, all of it goes to Toromare.
